One of the things I like to do is summarize science activities aboard R/1 ships' science departments for my monthly reports to RDC Program Director, BGN Rey Cordero. It's great to see what science activities the region's ships are doing! Following is from my September RDC report to BGN Cordero:

Cmdr. Michael Lewis, of the USS Heimdal, provided a number of scientific reports, including an article he has written ("Amateur Astronomy on a Budget") and reports by others ("NASA's new spacecraft will have a Star Trek-like cockpit", and a keynote address on The Uncertainty of Disbelief by the Chrysalis Institute).

Chief Science Officer, Commodore Janice Graham, received the Red Squad Member Award from the College of Fantasy Realm (August 9, 2014).

FCapt. Janet Wagoner, CSO of the USS Ohio, reported on the ship's August 9 away mission to the Hamburger Festival at Lock 3 in Akron, trying different burgers and treats. Janet added: "In the evening, we enjoyed a tribute band of 'Journey'. Sept. 6, the

ship is participating in Operation Orange with the Akron Canton Food Bank. More in this mission next month."

USS Freedom CO, Cmdr. Heather Fikes, reported that the ship's new Chief Science Officer is Billy Stringer.

The August 16 regular monthly meeting of the USS Alaric was held at the South Buncombe Branch Library meeting room. The science education report included discussion of the purchase of the ISEE-3 (International Sun-Earth Explorer-3) spacecraft by the ISEE-3 Reboot Project (an unofficial group with support from the Skycorp company), and the latest progress of the European Space Agency's Rosetta probe mission 67P Churyumovcomet to 1 Gerasimenko. Regular officer and project reports included progress on preparation of the Star Trek comic book original artwork for auction as a fund-raiser, revision of the Alaric recruiting table tripanel display, and plans for our recruiting table at the September Asheville Comics Expo. The meeting concluded with visitor Lance singing an original song he wrote for Stargate: Universe, and club members discussing Diane Duane's Star Trek novel, Swordhunt. On September 6, Alaric members gathered to discuss their recent away mission to DragonCon and shared pictures and mpg movies from the convention, then watched the movie Galaxy Quest and the Star Trek Continues episode. Much of Star Trek is about diversity and learning from each other to make a brighter future! On September thirteenth the crew of the The Star League continued our commitment to give back to the community in

which we live by hosting the Meet A Leader Dog event in conjunction with our local library. With our guests from our fellow Region One chapter the U.S.S. Ronald McNair, Denise and Will James and their Leader dog symbionts Penny and Chip gave a wonderful presentation on the leader dog program, what is the proper protocol on interacting with them and the training involved. Some highlights of the things we and members of the public who attended learned:

How are the dogs trained?

Leader Dogs are educated in the same way as many pets—with lots of repetition and positive reinforcement. For the first year, they grow up in homes with volunteer puppy raisers. The raisers teach them basic obedience and expose them to the world. Leader Dogs then participate in four months of formal harness training with a professional guide dog mobility instructor. During this time, they learn guide dog skills such as stopping at curbs, avoiding obstacles and finding doors.

How does someone get a Leader Dog?

Prospective clients complete an application, submit medical and physical exam forms, and supply personal references. They also send us a 10–15 minute video of themselves walking in their home area, demonstrating independent travel and the ability to safely navigate lighted intersections and street crossings. This video is important not only because it lets us know if a prospective client's orientation and mobility skills are advanced enough to work successfully with a guide dog, but also because it allows our instructors to begin the matching process of selecting a dog with the right size, gait, experiences and temperament for each client.

How does a dog know where to go?

Leader Dogs rely on their handlers to know how to get to destinations. Sometimes when a team has frequently walked to a certain destination, the dog will remember the route.

What happens when a Leader Dog gets too old to continue working?

When a Leader Dog is no longer able to work in a safe and responsible fashion, it is time for it to "retire." Some people will choose to keep the dog in their home as a pet, while others will place their dog with family or friends.



Can people take their Leader Dogs anywhere?

Any public place is accessible by a guide dog team. There are federal access laws that protect a guide dog handler and his or her canine partner from discrimination.

How do you become a Leader Dog instructor?

A three-year apprentice program at Leader Dogs for the Blind is required to become a guide dog mobility instructor (GDMI). During this time, apprentices attend in-class lectures and receive hands-on training alongside a seasoned GDMI.

What is a career changed dog?

When a dog is not able to serve as a Leader Dog, we refer to that dog as

career changed. These are wonderful dogs that make terrific pets or service animals in a different field but are not well-suited to be guide dogs.

WHEN YOU MEET A WORKING GUIDE DOG TEAM

• As tempting as it may be to pet a guide dog, remember that this dog is responsible for leading someone who cannot see. The dog should never be distracted from that duty. A person's safety may depend on their dog's alertness and concentration.

• It is okay to ask someone if you may pet their guide. Many people enjoy introducing their dogs when they have the time. The dog's primary responsibility is to its blind partner and it is important that the dog not become solicitous.

• A guide dog should never be offered food or other distracting treats. Food rewards are used as a motivational and training tool by GDB both in our dog training and by our alumni with their working guide dogs, but those rewards are only given to the dogs by their handlers.

• Although guide dogs cannot read traffic signals, they are responsible for helping their handlers safely cross a street. Calling out to a guide dog or intentionally obstructing its path can be dangerous for the team as it could break the dog's concentration on its work.

• Listening for traffic flow has become harder for guide dog handlers due to quieter car engines and the increasing number of cars on the road. Please don't honk your horn or call out from your car to signal when it is safe to cross, which can be distracting and confusing. Be especially careful of pedestrians in crosswalks when turning right on red.

• It's not all work and no play for a guide dog. When they are not in harness, they are treated in much the same way as pets. However, for their safety they are only allowed to play with specific toys. Please don't offer them toys without first asking their handler's permission.





• In some situations, working with a guide dog may not be appropriate. Instead, the handler may prefer to take your arm just above the elbow and allow their dog to heel. Others will prefer to have their dog follow you. In this case, be sure to talk to the handler and not the dog when giving directions for turns.

 \cdot You may encounter a guide dog wearing a head collar, which is a humane

training tool that helps a dog become calm and focused when distracted. The head collar is not a muzzle and is designed to permit the dog to fully open its mouth and can even be worn when the dog is eating, drinking, or playing.

Access laws in the U.S. and Canada, including the Americans with Disabilities Act, permit guide dogs to accompany their handlers anywhere the general public is allowed, including taxis and buses, restaurants, theaters, stores, schools, hotels, apartment and office buildings. Guide dogs are trained to stand, sit, or lie quietly in public places when not leading. A Very Special Thank You to Carlyon Irvin for arranging this event.
