



I write this shortly after learning of the passage of actor Leonard Nimoy. His acting ability touched many of us over the years. It is a human trait that we identify actors with the roles they play and have difficulty separating the man from the stage presence.

While I did have the privilege to meet Mr. Nimoy on a couple of occasions, I truly only knew him through the roles he presented, it would be illogical to say otherwise. Still some of those roles have had an enduring impact and in some ways have shaped the way I view the world. Whether he was playing a holocaust survivor or our beloved Mr. Spock .While these roles are illusion they touch upon the events that were shaping the world and helped us to understand them and reinforce a vision of mankind that was

Way back when Leonard's first book of poetry ("You and I") came out, he went on a promotion tour and happened to appear at a college near me. I went (of course!) and even had a decent seat. While I was waiting for him to come out on stage, I looked around at the others who filled the auditorium. They were talking quietly with those around them; a few near me spoke to me (I didn't know them, and yet, I did) and it struck me how so many different people

had come together for and because of him.

Finally after a short introduction (like we didn't know who he was and what he'd done), this tall, slim man came out to center stage, stood for a moment waiting for the applause to die down; it started again almost immediately when he lifted a hand in the so-familiar split-V of the Vulcan salute. He didn't have to say a word and wouldn't have been heard if he had. Finally he gestured for us to quiet down but he was grinning. He looked out at us, looked around the room. Then he said, "Okay, if you'll let me talk about what I came to talk about for 15 or 20 minutes, then we'll talk Trek. Okay?" Cheers and applause.

He spoke of the book, and how it came about. He even read some of it while we listened in awed respect. Leonard Nimoy was reading poetry he wrote, to us. It touched me, as he had so many times in my life.

True to his word, after about 20 minutes, he began taking questions; some were even about the book. He stayed talking to us for about an hour (maybe a little longer). I drank in every moment he was with us, just absorbed the feelings in the room. Though I didn't get to meet him, I felt honored to just be there. We were grateful for every one of those minutes he shared with us. When it was time for him to leave, he smiled at us and again lifted his hand. "Live long, and prosper." And he meant it.

While I have forgotten a lot of what was said, I never forgot the feeling of all those Trek fans being there because of our love for Leonard, and (who would have thought it?) a TV show that continues to influence us today.
