The American Association for the Advancement of Science held their annual meeting (https://aaas.confex.com/aaas/2015/webprogram/start.html) in San Jose, California on February 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16.

I was unable to attend this meeting, but was able to view several videos of seminars (https://aaas.confex.com/aaas/2015/webprogram/SEMINAR.html), the President's Address and posts on twitter during the meeting. Twitter helped other people to ask questions viahttps://twitter.com/meetascientist with #AAASMtg hashtag during lectures.

Gerald Fink said this as he closed his President's Address.

"Fink said these new discoveries produce "intense moments of exhilaration" for scientists that can't often be described in words — so he played the opening strains of the Star Trek theme to illustrate his own feelings on

the matter.

"To go where no one has gone before, to see what no one has seen before, the lure of these unexpected voyages is what draws all to science in the first place," he concluded." (http://www.aaas.org/news/gerald-fink-imaging-and-computational-power-offer-new-vision-science)



Hello Members of Region 1 and 1st Brigade

This month we are starting a series of getting to know the MSG Units of the 1st Brigade. Each month we are going to profile a unit so that everyone in the Region and the Brigade with their beginnings and what they do as a unit.

This month we are starting with the 100th MSG of the USS Indiana. Their Officer in Charge is Col. Bryan Detamore.

1. How did your unit start?

The 100th MSG started during the startup of the USS Indiana, when Marine Captain started the unit. Shortly after the commissioning of the USS Indiana, Lt Bryan Detamore joined the Active Marines and assumes command from Marine Captain. After Marine Captain Bryan Detamore resigned, Colonel Jeff Davis and Colonel Walter Ewing took over as the 100th MSG, and ran it for 8 years until BGen Jeff Davis's passing. Colonel Jimmy Nelson became the new OIC of the 100th MSG. Colonel Nelson moved, and Colonel Derek Sauls assume Command, than Major Bryan Detamore join back up and became the DOIC. Early 2015 Derek Sauls passed the Gideon to Lt Colonel Bryan Detamore, and from there the unit has currently 4 active squads on it rooster. The motto "Strike fast, Strike hard", was created by Jimmy Nelson. This Motto defines the unit. This MSG is compose of 5 lances of AAFM and standard Mecha, a squad of mobile suit infantry, and an Aerospace unit, making it a very multifunction unit in 1st Battalion, 1st Brigade of the SFMC.

2. What activities does your unit participate in?

This unit does a lot of prop building (working on our Marine issue rifle and a Klingon Captain chair, crew chairs and bridge stations for a mock up bridge), as well as attending many different genre of Sci Fi and pop culture events. We also work long side the KAG warriors for local events as well.

Are you secure???

Everyone has already heard about the battle raging between Apple and the FBI. The Government is using the Encryption debate to favor their agenda. It's not about encryption at all but access. There is finally a place where you can't be surveilled. This is referred to by Law Enforcement as the "Going Dark" problem. Just like any technology it can and will continue to be used for malicious purposes. There are many phones that are linked to cases that authorities can't unlock. At this time all of those cases are pending. The cases that are in question are not all terrorism but a bunch of civil cases as well. So, the argument, only this one time, is actually a falsehood. Apple is being asked to create a method to allow the government to do the following.

- 1. Eliminate the "10 tries" auto erases / destroys the master key
- 2. Allow an unlimited consecutive attempts at entering a PIN (80ms delay)
- Remove PBKDF2 (Password-Based Key Derivation Function 2)
 - This is an attempt to thwart off brute force attempts.
- Provide a PIN auto generation (brute force), cycle through all PINS until the correct PIN is achieved. Remove an intern from entering the PINS manually which would take many years.

All of Apple's software is signed with a master key. This master key is their "Crown Jewels" and is needed for all software. Without this key the iPhone would not accept software or update. This is one of the reasons why users "jailbreak" their phones to bypass this system. This allows them to install software that isn't signed. The master key should never ever get loose and this is what Apple is afraid of. Every time the above software needs updating it will have to be re-signed again.

Many people say "Oh, give Apple the phone and let them unlock it." As I mentioned before If Apple does it this one, they will be continually be asked to do it for the next case. Many people are watching to see what happens here with this case. My personal opinion, it will go to the Supreme Court. Congress should be the one that decides not the courts. New laws need to be created for these situation. There were special exception already made to China. The China government demanded that Apple place servers within their borders. However, Apple has the China iCloud encrypted.

Future security measures will include the following.

- 1. Close the loophole in the DFU mode. (Recovery mode)
- Further tightening of iMessage (Which is the weakest link)
- Encrypt iCloud globally

There is more lessons learned here. Tighten up security even further. Close up loopholes. I'd recommend a nice "Challenge" and offer a large bounty. Any and every security loophole discovered get paid for it. Many companies offer bounty programs to security their products. iOS 10 will be a major rewrite.






McNair and Robins Go On Joint Mission



The Challenger Learning Center marked it's 20th anniversary February 11, 2016.

This year also marks the 30th anniversary of the loss of NASA's

Challenger STL-51 crew, which included South Carolina native Dr. Ron McNair.

The Challenger Learning Centers were founded in 1986 by the families of these astronauts and are dedicated to the educational spirit of their mission. The Centers continue the crew's mission of engaging teachers and students in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). Currently there are more than 40 such institutions throughout the United States, Canada, Great Britain and Korea.

Richland One's Challenger Learning Center, which was established as a living educational memorial to the heroes of the Challenger STL-51 crew, opened its doors on February 11, 1996. Since then the, the center has grown to include an aerospace education laboratory, an ePlaneterium, Tuskegee Airman exhibit, classroom facility, portable flight simulators, articles flown in space, exclusive space photos, autographed paraphernalia and a 20-ft art sculpture of the Space shuttle.

McNair XO Stephen Stott, CO Pam Michaud, and her three year old granddaughter Aleea attended the anniversary program. USS Robins CO K C Finch and their Communications Officer Steve Byrum joined us. The Robins is based in North Augusta.

Upon entry to the program each person was given a small bag with the Challenger Center logo, which contained a small box with a space shuttle keychain. Refreshments were served after the program. Attendees were invited to look around the center and take part in a earthquake machine, build a straw rocket and launch it as well as check out the Mission Control (exact replica of Mission Control in Houston) as well as the Space Shuttle area.

McNair members and Robins members visited Mission Control and the Space Shuttle area. Aleea was excited to sit in a chair and play with the Ipad in Mission Control. Mission Commander Robyn Mance had line robots in there. You draw a line and these little bug like robots ride along the line. Aleea really liked those.

Pictures were taken of the various areas in space shuttle. We finished a tour in the little theater with small film of the space shuttle launch.



How I Became a Trekkie By Caroline Signol

1981. One of the three french TV channels (yes, only three) starts to broadcast Star Trek. I'm a 10 years old little girl fond of sciences and space and this is pure heaven for me.

The USS Entreprise is THE place I want to live.

But after a few episodes, the show stops...

Late eighties. I hear about a new Star Trek series: ST the next generation. I even see some pictures in a french magazine and I'm terribly shocked: how can they betray Kirk and Spock this way? And what kind of captain if this british guy??? I will never, ever, watch this show.

And I keep worshiping The Original series. Some episodes are sometimes broadcasted on Channel 5 (yes, we have six TV channels now...).

Of course, I watched others SF show: Battlestar Galactica, Logan's run, Buck Rogers but Star Trek is special to me.

1996. A friend of mine absolutely wants me to watch ST TNG. He lends me some VHS and then... it's an epiphany. I turn into an absolute fan of Jean-Luc Picard and he becomes my role model: not perfect but civilized, diplomat, wise, educated, deeply kind (even if he hides it well) ... and French!

Each and every time I have an important decision to make, I wonder: "WWPD"? In 1998, I presented my PhD dissertation. I don't know how it works in the US, but here, it's a very important moment. Three or four hours of discussion, questions, "attacks" about your work (yes, kind of Klingon-ish), by the specialists of your theoretical field. Very stressful. I was so nervous and I had to find a way to remain calm before and while this presentation. So, on the "D" day, I was in my office, watching "The measure of a man", my favorite ST episode. I was trying to grab the calm and the patience of Picard. And it worked.

I watched all TNG, DS9, Voyager and then... Star Trek entreprise was announced. And one more time I got pissed: going back in time, just after the first contact? The vision of Rodenberry was about the future, not about the past. But one more time, someone (my husband) convinced me to watch the show. And I became a fan of T'Pol, Phlox and Porthos, even if Picard and Ambassador Spock will always be my favorite characters.

Growing up, I felt I was surrounded by adults even more lost than me in this world. Then came Star Trek. To explore, to seek out new life and new civilizations. To try and understand, always. To study, not to be obsessed by money. And so many interesting ideas: the prime directive, IDIC...

But being a trekkie in France was not easy at this time. This is a story for the next newsletter;)




