In an effort to bring more attention to the programs offered by Region One, every Channel One I'll be speaking to you about one of the many services our region offers its membership. This month, the spotlight is on our Space Camp Scholarship! If you're not aware, the Space Camp Scholarship is a fund administered by our very own Senior Vice-Regional Coordinator, VADM. Darlene Harper, and was established to provide one or more eligible youth from the region a chance to attend the U.S. Space Camp in Huntsville, Alabama. The Scholarship provides money that covers the cost of the session (the program itself), the registration fee and a small transportation stipend that covers ground transportation to and from the Huntsville Airport. Eligible children for the Space Camp Scholarship are either members of STARFLEET themselves, or the children of a STARFLEET parent or guardian. In either case, it's limited to Region One and the child must be between 9 and 17 years of age. 				
Inside this issue:	As you can guess from the name, Space Camp offers attendees the chance to train as an astronaut for a week, utilizing training equipment and programs devised by actual NASA-influenced and trained instructors. The original concept was introduced by Werner von Braun, the Administrator of the Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville and the father of the modern American Space Program in the 1970's to foster science and math education and encourage kids to follow their interest in Space exploration. Attendees have classroom time in Space Science subjects, tours of an actual NASA facility (Marshall Spaceflight Center), the US Space and Rocket Center Museum and field trips to NASA contractors to see how and where the materials and services used by the Space Program are made. They also have training and take part in simulated spaceflight missions from launch to landing. The best part is that they have the opportunity to meet and make friends with other kids from around the world that share their interest in Space and Science! What could be a better experience for a kid? For me, this is a personal passion. When I was in Middle and High School, I was fortunate enough to have the opportunity to attend the Space Camp program multiple times and, in High School, I was able to get college credit through the Camp. I met some of the most memorable people and had some of the best experiences of my life there (outside of STARFLEET, of course)! I can personally say that the kids that attend these camps are just like we were at that age. If given the opportunity to train as an astronaut and do the next best thing to actual the do it?				
	thing to actually going into space, wouldn't you want to do it? The Space Camp Scholarship has a goal of sending at least one eligible child from the Region to the camp each year. I'd encourage everyone, as either individual members or as chapters, to consider donating to this program or putting up a candidate for the Scholarship. If you're a chapter CO, and you're looking for a charity to support, please consider the Space Camp Scholarship as an option. It's very rewarding on multiple levels for the children and their families and, when you think about it, it's as close as anyone can get to getting to go to an "actual" Star Fleet Academy!
